
## A Great Day in Harlem at the AMC Magic Johnson Theater!



[New York, NY – JUNE 5, 2019] – The People's Film Festival presented by The People's Media Music & Arts Foundation wrapped up is 8<sup>th</sup> season as scores of people ascended on the AMC Magic Johnson Theater in Harlem for a final festive day of film, live art, and new technology.

The 3-day festival held May 30 – June 1, 2019 featured 65 independent films from 10 different countries—26 of which were films directed by women, 25 were New York based film directors – 7 of which were from Harlem. "APRIL AGAIN" directed by Queens, NY filmmaker Tyrel Hunt was the top winner of this year's festival taking home "Best Film & Best Actor (Khari Constantine), on their film in which a homeless mute, young couple and reformed criminal's fates tragically intersect on one unforgivable day in Queens, New York. Bronx filmmaker Sandra Nixon took home Best Documentary for her film "SUBOA – Making the Call"—a film about 8 men from Harlem who blew the whistle for equality in the game of basketball. Ironically, that call still resonates today as it was sent out to hundreds of SUBOAN Members who jampacked the theater to watch the premiere screening of this documentary. We were also honored to screen "The Uncle Nearest Story", a film directed by David Poag, narrated by Emmy-Award winning actor Jeffrey Wright, which tells the untold story of Nathan 'Nearest' Green, the first known African American master distiller on record, who is the slave that taught young Jack Daniels everything about whiskey. Uncle Nearest Premium Whiskey were also the Official Sponsors of the Filmmakers Networking Event at Harlem Hops.





This year's festival also included the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual "Tech People Expo" a free event at the AMC Magic Johnson Theater in which attendees engage in live VR experiences, gaming and immersive storytelling and a VR Lounge sponsored by 1<sup>st</sup> Republic Bank. VR Filmmakers Tyler Huyser, director of "WALK IN MY SHOES", Stina Hamilin – "CYPHER 360 featuring Reggie Reg" and Saddah Espii Proctor – "Girl Icon" presented their live VR experiences to attendees. Other exhibitors included "Jump Into the Light", Zanib Ahmad from the NYC Dept of Consumer and Worker Protections (DCWP) distributed vital info such as "Freelance Isn't Free Act-Worker Protection" to empower those who work in the entertainment industry and live painting from artists Andre Trenier (andretrenier.com) from the Bronx, Claudia Marulanda (claudiamarulanda.com) from Queens by way of Colombia and Harlem native Lance "Estos" Bradly (renallifekidney.org) who's uses his art to draw awareness to kidney transplant.



TPFF also hosted **The Public Media Awards of Excellence annual breakfast**, which honors Public & Cable Access Producers at **MNN El Barrio Community Media Center with Director Zenaida Mendez**. 14 New York base Public Access Producers were awarded for their excellence in producing their own cable shows. **Anthony Riddle, BRIC's Senior Vice President for Community Media** gave a powerful testimony and introduction on the importance of "free speech tv" and creating your own television.

The People's Film Festival is an initiative of The People's Media, Music & Arts Foundation (TPMMAF)— a non-profit corporation whose purpose is to promote awareness in independent music, media, and art across the globe while encouraging those—particularly in the Harlem New York area, to develop a greater appreciation and understanding for cultural diversity in film.
